Big Word Review

Salvation – Jesus saves Propitiation – Jesus takes Redemption – Jesus pays Justification – Jesus stands

A Crucial Question:

How do I believe God sees me?

noun Theology

The act in which messed up sinners are made right in the sight of a perfect and holy God.

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished. – *Romans 3:23-25*

We have been justified...

By grace alone

But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. – *Titus 3:4-7*

Through faith alone

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. – *Romans 5:1-2*

How do we try to justify ourselves?

- 1. We measure ourselves by our own standard
- 2. We measure ourselves against the actions of others
- 3. We work really hard to gain God's approval

Because of Jesus alone

He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification. – *Romans 4:25*

"We... know that a man is not justified by observing the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by observing the law, because by observing the law no one will be justified.

"If, while we seek to be justified in Christ, it becomes evident that we ourselves are sinners, does that mean that Christ promotes sin? Absolutely not!" – *Galatians 2:15-17*

The Gospel says: God accepts you just as Christ is.
