Big Words, Simple Definitions

Salvation - Jesus saves

Propitiation - Jesus takes

Redemption – Jesus pays

Justification - Jesus stands

Regeneration – Holy Spirit <u>revives</u>

We were all spiritually <u>dead</u>

At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another. – *Titus 3:3*

As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our sinful nature and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature objects of wrath. – *Ephesians 2:1-3*

We all needed to be revived

(John 3:3, Romans 7:14-24, Romans 8:7-9)

The work of the Holy Spirit to renew and revive spiritually dead people

God renewed our souls

But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. — *Titus 3:4-7*

The regenerative work of the Holy Spirit paves the way for...

A new beginning

...Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again." – *John 3:3*

A new creation

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! – 2 Corinthians 5:17

A new life

But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. – *Ephesians 2:4-5*

A new disposition

You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; to be made new in the attitude of your minds; and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness. — *Ephesians 4:22-24*

A new heart

I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. – *Ezekiel 36:26*
