theodicy: from Greek *theos* (God) and *dikeo* (righteous, just or loving)

The Answers

God is God, and we are not.

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the LORD. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. – Isaiah 55:8-9

Man has been granted the ability to make genuine choices.

"But, if serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve..." – Joshua 24:15

There is a way that seems right to a man but in the end it leads to death. – Proverbs 14:12

Sin is destructive.

For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the glorious freedom of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. — Romans 8:20-22

Satan is bent on destroying all that is good.

"The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy" - John 10:10

Your enemy prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. - 1 Peter 5:8

<u>Perspective</u> is challenging.

He led you through the vast and dreadful desert, that thirsty and waterless land, with its venomous snakes and scorpions. He brought you water out of hard rock.
