God is <u>trustworthy</u>

vs.

God is not to be trusted

The Lord's Prayer is both *prescriptive* and *descriptive*.

Matthew 6:9-13

⁹ Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,

¹⁰ your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

¹¹ Give us today our daily bread.

¹² And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

¹³ And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

God is our Father (verse 9)

God is near (verse 9)

God is present (verse 9)

God is holy (verse 9)

God is <u>pure</u> (verse 9)

God is powerful (verse 10)

God is providing (verse 11)

God is forgiving (verse 12)

God is pardoning (verse 12)

God is protective (verse 13)

God is trustworthy (verses 9-13)

Trust is always lived out in action.

To the pure, all things are pure, but to those who are corrupted and do not believe, nothing is pure. In fact, both their minds and consciences are corrupted. They claim to know God, but by their actions they deny him. - Titus 1:15-16a

Next Steps
