God is light.

Light: Illumination that makes sight possible

⁵This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. ⁷ But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin. —1 John 1:5-7

Light is pure (vs. 5)

Light penetrates darkness and exposes reality (vs. 6)

Light unites (vs. 7)

When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."
—John 8:12

Without <u>crushing</u>, there is no light

"You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. —Matthew 5:14-16

Being light demands <u>illumination</u> (vs. 14)

Being light requires exposure (vs. 15)

Being light reflects the true light (vs. 16)

A caution to the light bearers: Jesus is the exposing light, not you!
