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# False Narrative: God forgets people

But God remembered Noah and all the wild animals and the livestock that were with him in the ark, and he sent a wind over the earth, and the waters receded. - Genesis 8:1

So when God destroyed the cities of the plain, he remembered Abraham, and he brought Lot out of the catastrophe that overthrew the cities where Lot had lived. - Genesis 19:29

Then God remembered Rachel; he listened to her and enabled her to conceive. - Genesis 30:22

## The Real Story: God forgets sin

For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more." - Hebrews 8:12

"I, even I, am he who blots out your transgressions, for my own sake, and remembers your sins no more. -Isaiah 43:25

### The Rest of the Story: I have not been forgotten

#### God remembers my conversation

<sup>16</sup> Then those who feared the Lord talked with each other, and the Lord listened and heard. A scroll of remembrance was written in his presence concerning those who feared the Lord and honored his name. <sup>17</sup> "On the day when I act," says the Lord Almighty, "they will be my treasured possession. I will spare them, just as a father has compassion and spares his son who serves him. <sup>18</sup> And you will again see the distinction between the righteous and the wicked, between those who serve God and those who do not. –Malachi 3:16-18
