## God is demanding.

### **Examples of God's Demands**

God demands <u>a son/sacrifice</u> (Genesis 22)

God demands compliance (Psalm 119:4)

God demands a yard sale (Matthew 19:21)

God demands <u>a career change</u> (Matthew 4:19)

God demands truth (Acts 5:1-11)

### What's the motivation behind God's demands?

<u>My good</u>

# God demands my complete <u>loyalty</u> because he knows that any other allegiance results in <u>idolatry</u>.

"You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an image in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commandments." **– Exodus 20:3-6** 

# God demands my <u>purity</u> because he knows that any other choice results in <u>shame</u>.

Flee from sexual immorality. All other sins a person commits are outside the body, but whoever sins sexually, sins against their own body. Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your bodies. – 1 Corinthians 6:18

# God demands my righteousness (<u>right living</u>) because he knows the <u>rich reward</u> of obedience.

He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God. – Micah 6:8

### **False Narrative:** God is too demanding and <u>never satisfied</u>.

...Not just to know that God exists, and that he created and supervised the whole enterprise, but also to know what "he" demands of us — from our diet to our observances to our sexual morality. In other words, in a vast and complicated discussion where we know more and more about less and less, yet can still hope for some enlightenment as we proceed, one faction — itself composed of mutually warring factions — has the sheer arrogance to tell us that we already have all the essential information we need. Such stupidity, combined with such pride, should be enough on its own to exclude "belief" from the debate. The person who is certain, and who claims divine warrant for his certainty, belongs now to the infancy of our species.
