The Identity of the Liar

You belong to your father, the devil, and you want to carry out your father's desire. He was a murderer from the beginning, not holding to the truth, for there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies. – John 8:44

The Tools of the Liar's Trade

- Temptation (Mark 1:13)
- Accusation (Revelation 12:10)
- Condemnation (Zechariah 3:1)
- Influence (John 13:2)
- Devastation (John 10:10)
- Deceit (Genesis 3:1-7)

The Oldest Lie in the Book: You can't trust God.

The Anatomy of a Lie

- Doubt God's Word "Did God really say ...?"
- Deny God's Word "You will not surely die,"
- Disobey God's Word "...she took some of it and ate it."

Same Lie, Different Story (Matthew 4:1-10)

- You can't trust God to provide (Matthew 4:1-4)
- You can't trust God to save you (Matthew 4:5-7)
- You can't trust God to be enough (Matthew 4:8-10)

Three areas where we struggle to trust God and buy the lie:

- 1. Identity I don't trust who God says I am
- 2. Finances I don't trust God's plan
- 3. Relationships I don't trust God to fix my relationships

The Triumph of the Truth

They overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death. – *Revelation 12:11*

The Identity of the Truth

[Jesus said to them,] "Yet because I tell the truth, you do not believe me! Can any of you prove me guilty of sin? If I am telling the truth, why don't you believe me? He who belongs to God hears what God says. The reason you do not hear is that you do not belong to God." – John 8:45-47

The truth for today: You <u>can trust</u> God.

...if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved. As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame."
