

Part 7 The Lie: Temptation Always Wins Pastor Grant Fishbook November 14 & 15, 2009

The Lie: Temptation always wins.

The Truth: Temptation can be defeated through the power of <u>Jesus</u>.

James 1:12-15

Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him. When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone; but each one is tempted when, by his own evil desire, he is dragged away and enticed. Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death.

What can we learn?

- Temptation does not come from God
- Temptation is rooted in our own evil desires
- Temptation is a <u>process</u> (desire, enticement, more desire, sin, death)

1 Corinthians 10:12-13

So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall! No temptation has seized you except what is common to man. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it.

What can we learn?

- If you think you are immune to temptation, you are wrong
- Temptation happens to everyone
- · God never allows more temptation than we can handle
- When we are tempted God always provides a way out

The way out may be a: Door

The most powerful weapon against temptation: Prayer

Pray that you will not fall into temptation. - Luke 22:40

Hebrews 2:17-18

For this reason [Jesus] had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.

Hebrews 4:15-16

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet was without sin. Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

What can we learn about God when we are tempted?

- · Jesus wants to help us have victory over temptation
- Jesus experienced temptation firsthand
- · God invites us to the throne room to find grace and mercy
