

In Psalm 40, King David states:

This is where I was...

¹I waited patiently for the LORD; he turned to me and heard my cry. ²He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire;

This is where I am...

...he set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand. ³ He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God. Many will see and fear and put their trust in the LORD. ⁴ Blessed is the man who makes the LORD his trust, who does not look to the proud, to those who turn aside to false gods.

⁷Then I said, "Here I am, I have come— it is written about me in the scroll.

This is where I'm going...

⁸I desire to do your will, O my God; your law is within my heart." ⁹I proclaim righteousness in the great assembly; I do not seal my lips, as you know, O LORD. ¹⁰I do not hide your righteousness in my heart; I speak of your faithfulness and salvation. I do not conceal your love and your truth from the great assembly.

¹⁷Yet I am poor and needy; may the Lord think of me.

This is my hope...

You are my help and my deliverer; O my God, do not delay.
